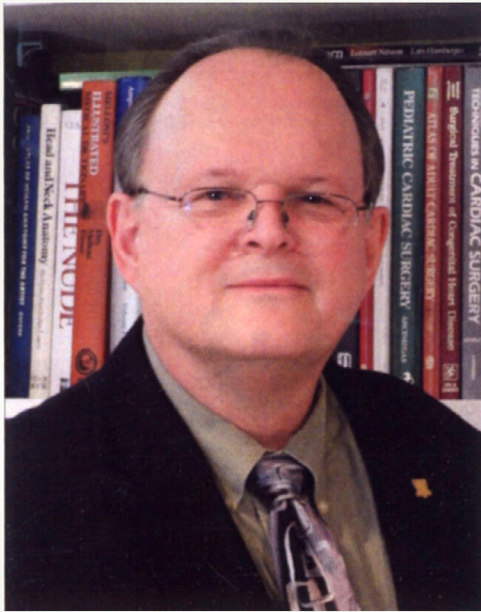

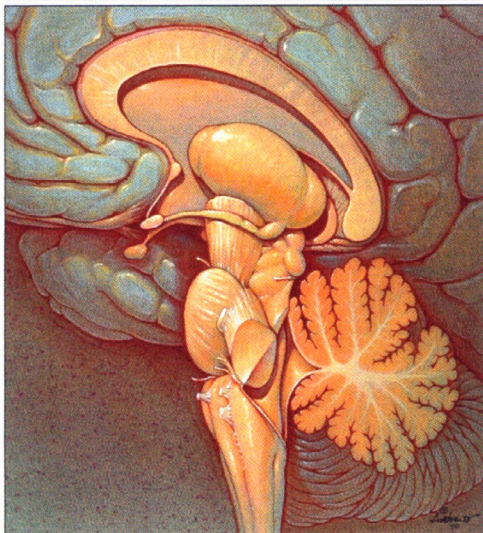


## WILLIAM M ANDREWS
